Growth of Himachal Pradesh: historical overview

Shimla turned into the mid year capital of India actually lodging the old structures exhibiting the English magnificence. Subsequent to settling the issues the rulers and the Government of India chose to shape an association of these states and named it Himachal Pradesh. Subsequently, Himachal Pradesh was figured as a section 'C' state (association region) of Indian Union on fifteenth April, 1948 by incorporating 31 of all shapes and sizes slope states and continued as before till 1956. Later the order of states as A, B, C was considered for abrogation by states' Re-association Commission and proposals were made for the consolidation of all 'C' states either with the adjacent conditions of higher status or to be kept up with independently as association domains till any further choice. Himachal kept up with its status as a Union Territory till the conferment of Statehood on 25th January, 1971. The domain involved five regions: Mahasu, Sirmaur, Bilaspur, Mandi and Chamba. In 1960, the line Chini tehsil of Mahasu region was cut out as a different managerial unit and region Kinnaur was framed drifting the complete number of locale to six. [4] On 1st November, 1966, the province of

Haryana was planned revamping the current territory of Punjab and around then spaces of Kullu, Kangra, Shimla and some bumpy spaces of Hoshiarpur region and Dalhousie of Gurdaspur locale were converged into Himachal Pradesh making the four new regions viz. Kullu, Lahaul and Spiti, Kangra and Shimla in Himachal Pradesh and consolidating Dalhousie into Chamba region. With this gradual addition, Himachal Pradesh accounted of ten regions, a space of 55,673 sq. km and a populace of 28.12 lakh as indicated by 1961 statistics. [4] On 1st September 1972, Hamirpur and Una locale were made by trifurcation of region Kangra. Shimla and Solan locale were planned after the revamping of Mahasu and Solan.

Problems because of urbanization

URBAN DEVELOPOMENT IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

Himachal Pradesh known as Dev Bhoomi (blessed land) and the Horticulture State of India with a space of 55,673 sq.km. also, populace of 5,170,877 (1991 enumeration), positioned fifteenth based on region and eighteenth based on populace. It represents 0.21 percent of complete metropolitan populace of the country.. It lies somewhere in the range of 30°22' and 33°12' north scopes and 75°47' and 79°4' east longitudes. Toward the east it frames India's boundary with Tibet, toward the north lies the provinces of Jammu and Kashmir, in the south-east lies Uttar Pradesh, and Haryana and in the West Punjab. The whole domain of the state is bumpy with rises changing from 350 to 7000 meters above mean ocean level. Geologically it frames part of the Punjab Himalayas, which itself address a muddled example of mountain reaches, slopes and valleys. Himachal Pradesh is officially separated into 12 areas, 67 tehsils, 30 sub-tehsils and 69 squares. There are 19,388 towns of which 16,997 towns are occupied and there are 58 towns (1991 census).^ The economy of Himachal Pradesh was overwhelmed by agribusiness. It gives direct work to about 63.2 percent (1991 enumeration) populace.

Process of Urbanization

The factor which advanced metropolitan development in early-chronicled period for the most part were the authentic instead of monetary. While in present day time span it is administered by the specialized and financial components which is liable for mechanical upheaval and which is emphatically associated with urbanization measure. So in this manner urbanization is the spatial accompanying marvels of cycle of social changes, modernization and populace focus. Urbanization is a pointer of progress in occupation,

Any settlement is metropolitan in the event that it has some neighborhood organization like Municipal Corporation, Notified Area Committee, Cantonment Board, Municipal Committee, and so on as per Indian Census. (I) populace more than 5000, (ii) thickness ought to be in excess of 400 people/sq.km and (iii) in excess of 75% of its male laborers ought to be in non-agribusiness area. Aside from these. Directorate of Census likewise have the optional ability to proclaim any region as urban.

Urbanization prior to 1981

Himachal Pradesh entered the 20th century with an exceptionally low base of metropolitan populace (4.02 percent) and it appears to be that this low metropolitan populace is being kept up with by the turn of this century. The little estimated metropolitan focuses overwhelmed the metropolitan scene of the state. After the autonomy, there has been huge ascent in the quantity of towns and the level of metropolitan populace in the state. Among the states in Indian Union, Himachal Pradesh has metropolitan populace not exactly the National normal due to its means farming economy, least industrialization, low availability, unpredictable territory and unfavorable climatic conditions. The development of metropolitan populace is the consequence of authoritative extension instead of advancement of the region. During the period from 1941 to 1971 the state was under the course of re-association. Himachal Pradesh appeared as a Chief Commissioner's area on April 15, 1948 because of consolidation of 31 past regal territories of Punjab and Shimla slopes into Indian Union (Joshi, 1984). Every one of the spaces of the state were partitioned into four regions viz. Mahasu, Mandi, Chamba and Sirmour with a space of 27.169 sq.km. In 1951 it was made a section 'C state. Just July 1, 1954 the adjoining part 'C territory of Bilaspur was converged with it as fifth region. Then, at that point after 1956, it was agreed the situation with Union Territory and in 1960 the Kinnaur district was converged with it. For smooth working of the express, a regional chamber was established. After this, on November 1, 1966, on the suggestion of parliamentary council headed by Hukum Singh, the consolidation of Kulu, Kangra, Lahul and Spiti, Shimla and bumpy spaces of Hoshiarpur region and Dalhousie of Gurdaspur area was influenced with Himachal Pradesh comprising four new locale viz. Kangra, Lahul and Spiti, Kullu and Shimla and Dalhousie was converged with Chamba region. In this way the state came into its current shape. The Government of India granted it undeniable statehood on January 25, 1971. Then, at that point on September 1, 1972 two additional regions viz. Hamirpur and Una were made by trifurcation of Kangra region and the Solan and Mahasu

region were perceived as Shimla and Solan region." Due to consolidation of different august state and new regions, they lost their own personality, turned into a piece of the new state. The state has enlisted 480.9 percent metropolitan development rate in 90 years. The negative development rate was recorded during the decade 1901-1911 because of predominance of dry season and pandemics. From there on a constant expansion in metropolitan populace is taken note. The development pace of metropolitan populace was 78.7 percent in the time of 1941-51 as an enormous number of evacuees from Pakistan relocated to metropolitan spaces of Himachal Pradesh because of parcel. Then, at that point onwards moderate development rate was capable, while in 1961 lethargic development rate was the aftereffect of reasonable changes in characterizing the metropolitan centre.° During the times of 1961-81, the metropolitan populace expanded around 45% from 178,275 people (1961) to 325,971 people (1981). The state capital arises as class II town in 1971 statistics interestingly. In this manner Vr^e metropolitan organization gave the social framework in provincial areas.

Urbanization in 1981-91

Himachal Pradesh is one of the most un-urbanized conditions of the nation as per 1991 statistics. The complete metropolitan populace of the state was 449,196 people, which is 8.6 percent of the state. In the decade (1981-91) the development pace of metropolitan populace was 37.8 percent when contrasted with 34.8 percent in the previous decade, which is higher than the public normal (36.2 percent). The expansion in the development pace of metropolitan populace can be credited to movement from the provincial regions which is widespread. The expansion in metropolitan populace is mostly because of development of new towns advised by the state Government, occasionally and because of developments of populace from provincial to metropolitan regions to benefit of better work and instructive facilities.^° There were 21 towns in Himachal Pradesh in 1901, the quantity of towns diminished to 11 out of 1911 and since 1921 enumeration onwards the number expanded. In 1981 this number was 47, and expanded to 58 out of 1991 enumeration. Out of these 58 towns upwards of 30 towns have the situation with advised region and 19 of city region. There were 7 cantonment sheets, one metropolitan enterprise (Shimla) and one Census Town Pandoh. The 11 towns which were added without precedent for 1991 enumeration are displayed in Table 1.1

The patterns of urbanization in Himachal Pradesh show that the development of metropolitan populace is extremely low making it the most un-urbanized state in India. Primary example shows the prevalence of unassuming communities and agglomerations. Shimla is the just one class-I town in the state which establishes very nearly one fourth of the all out metropolitan populace. By and by out of complete 53 tehsils 34 have metropolitan populace, yet there is recognizable spatial variety in the degree of urbanization. Four tehsils for example Shimla, Solan, Nahan and Sunder Nagar comprises roughly 50% of the complete metropolitan populace. Huge number of tehsils goes under 0.01 to 10 percent urbanization level, which is exceptionally low.
